The vision is now a reality! In 2022 the Orion Amphitheater opened in MidCity alongside an inviting food village, which is open year-round. The concert lineup has already featured Jack White, My Morning Jacket, and Earth, Wind & Fire.

FRONT ROW

The former Coca-Cola bottling factory on Clinton Avenue, across from the Von Braun Center's North Hall, will soon be transformed into Front Row, a multi-use development with lofts, offices, a hotel, retail space, and food and beverage establishments.

BACK FORTY BEER COMPANY

This Gadsden-based brewery is planning a new location in Huntsville, slated to open in 2023, making it our 13th brewery.

PARKS & RECREATION

The City of Huntsville boasts more than 65 parks, 15 recreation and community centers, 100 athletic fields, and 70-plus miles of trails and greenways. From sand volleyball to skateboarding, dog parks to disc golf, the Parks & Recreation Department is dedicated to meeting the city's diverse interests.

Today, our Parks & Recreation facilities are busier than ever as youth athletic participation is at an all-time high. There are also exciting projects underway, including the Joe Davis Stadium renovation, Phase II of the Sandra Moon Community Complex, construction of Legacy Park near Johnson Legacy Center, and continued development of Apollo Park near The Orion Amphitheater.

At John Hunt Park, work is underway on the new Get-A-Way Skatepark, renovation of Kids' Space, and creation of an 18-hole disc golf course. Meanwhile, an expansion of the Championship Fields will add two synthetic turf fields for soccer and lacrosse. The City has also committed to adding 44 new miles to the greenway system by next year.

To the moon and beyond

cientists and engineers worked here in the mid 20th century to develop the rockets that propelled America into space. Prior to this time, Huntsville was known for its cotton growers and as a key location for river trade.

Today the landscape has changed; cotton fields are now home to aerospace and manufacturing facilities, and the river is used primarily for recreation. The energy and drive of those early space pioneers are still pulsing through the community. Today, Huntsville is hard at work on the next chapter of out-of-this-world exploration, leading the Rocket City, the nation, and the world into tomorrow.

Towering over the street lights and trees, the mighty Saturn V Rocket on display at the U.S. Space & Rocket Center (USSRC) looks as though it is ready, all these decades later, to launch into the heavens for another mission. It is the iconic beacon that draws visitors to this impressive center, which serves as the official NASA Visitor Center for the Marshall Space Flight Center. Each year hundreds of thousands of visitors pass by on their journey through the Davidson Center for Space Exploration to see and appreciate artifacts like the Apollo 16 Command Module and an Apollo 12 moon rock.


At the ISS: Science on Orbit display, guests can tour a model of NASA's Payload Operations Integration



Center, the control center on Earth that manages the experiments conducted on the International Space Station. The tour continues with details about the complexities of environmental controls and life support systems that are needed to maintain life on the International Space Station.

To get a hands-on appreciation for the grueling conditions of space travel and exploration, visitors can opt for special add-on experiences including the Flight Simulator, which puts you in a simulated cockpit of the powerful F-18 Super Hornet. Get underwater with SCUBA Training and SeaTrek. Brave the G-Force Accelerator and experience the impact of three times the force of gravity. Always a favorite, the Multi-Axis Trainer sends you for a spin, tumbling on all three axes. If you are ready for more, try Moon Shot for a liftoff that rockets you 140 feet

straight up in a dizzying 2.5 seconds. There's even more! Watch a movie in the National Geographic Theater and visit the INTUITIVE® Planetarium.

fun options like Toddler Tuesdays, Summer STEAM Activities, Astronaut Chats, Teen Thursday Summer Science Club, Biergarten, and Cocktails & Cosmos.

THE COOLEST CAMPS

To help inspire the next generation of scientists, engineers, and astronauts, the USSRC opened Space Camp[®] in 1982. In the years



since, over 900,000 students from more than 150 international locations have graduated from the program, which uses astronaut training methods to focus on real applications of STEM principles. The immersive program even has students sleeping in quarters that resemble the International Space Station. In recent years the camp program has

expanded to include Aviation Challenge, Robotics Camp, and U.S. Cyber Camp.

Sharing tales of the past & future, local ATTRACT/ welcome you

HUNTSVILLE'S ATTRACTIONS INVITE YOU TO RETRACE THE STEPS OF HISTORY, APPRECIATE NATURE AND ART, AND ALWAYS REACH FOR THE STARS.

For a relaxing stroll surrounded by natural beauty, plan a visit to the **Huntsville Botanical Garden** with 118 acres of discovery. Open year-round, the garden boasts an array of ecosystems from woodland paths and aquatic habitats to grassy meadows and beautiful floral displays. The Lewis Birding Trail winds through those ecosystems to highlight the large variety of local and migratory birds.

Overlooking Little Smith Lake, the garden's Purdy Butterfly House is the nation's largest open-air butterfly house. If you want to bring your four-legged friend along, every Monday night dogs are welcome on dedicated pet-friendly paths. Seasonal events include Festifall and the holiday display Galaxy of Lights.





PERCHED ABOVE THE CITY ON 167 ACRES, Burritt

on the Mountain is home to an important part of our state's history. The centerpiece of the property is the eclectic X-shaped home of Dr. William Henry Burritt. Additional structures on the grounds include authentic 19th-century homes, a schoolhouse, blacksmith shop, and other outbuildings. The McCurdy Barnyard is a favorite among visitors who enjoy meeting the farm animals. Living-history interpreters help to bring the history of the period forward with demonstrations and hands-on activities.

Nature trails take hikers past historic coal mines and interesting limestone rock formations. During a spring trek the trails are transformed with wildflowers; in fall the beauty comes from autumn leaves. Throughout the year, the area is popular with birders and is listed on the Huntsville/Madison County Birding Trail.

TOUCH, CLIMB, AND EXPLORE-IT WAS DESIGNED FOR CHILDREN.

Too often we tell children not to touch things at a museum. However, at **EarlyWorks Children's Museum**, they are encouraged to engage with the exhibits! After all, that's how learning happens. Watch faces light up when they hear stories from the talking tree, including tales of Alabama history. At the Tinker Lab, engaging STEM lessons are hands-on for young scientists.





Imaginations will be floating down the river with play on a 46-foot keelboat, representative of river travel in the 19th century. Preschool-age visitors will enjoy the hands-on fun of Biscuit's Backyard, where the activities with building blocks and a water table help develop motor skills. The Passages Exhibit shares African American culture with artifacts and a mural. The museum's newest exhibit is Toy Takeover, which offers a peek inside popular toys to see how they work.



NESTLED IN THE BEAUTY OF BIG SPRING INTERNATIONAL PARK,

the **Huntsville Museum of Art** is home to a permanent collection of more than 3,200 objects. The primary focus is on 19th- and 20th-century American art with an emphasis on works from the Southeast. The collection includes works by Dale Chihuly and William Morris. In 2008, the museum acquired the expansive Sellars Collection of Art by American Women. Traveling exhibits provide reasons for many return visits.

HISTORY AND ART BLEND

at H.C. Blake Art & History Center. Dedicated to the promotion and preservation of both fine art and history, the center opened in 2020 and has quickly gained a following. The history side of the center is represented by Huntsville Revisited, which is home to a wide array of artifacts and historical photos. The displays are filled with fascinating stories about the people and places that have woven the fabric of the Huntsville and Madison County area.

FEDERAL ARCHITECTURE AND 19TH-CENTURY

HISTORY are on display at the Weeden House Museum and Garden. Built in 1819, the twostory brick house, purchased by Dr. William Weeden in 1845, was the birthplace of his daughter, well-known 19th-century artist and poet Maria Howard Weeden. Today, visitors to the house can appreciate the hand-carved mantels and spiral staircase. Guided tours share stories of the home before, during, and after the Civil War.

IN THE SHADOWS OF MODERN DOWNTOWN

HUNTSVILLE on the Square, step inside Alabama's oldest continuously operating hardware store, Harrison Brothers Hardware. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the store is now operated by the Historic Huntsville Foundation and features the original cash register, desk, safe, plus an everchanging collection of arts and crafts and a gift shop with books, prints, and other items relating to local history.







HOMES WITH HISTORY line the streets of Huntsville's residential districts. While these homes are not open for tours, you can enjoy a walking or driving tour to appreciate the architecture and character they provide. The Twickenham District features homes primarily from the early to late 1800s with a range of styles from Queen Anne to Greek Revival. Old Town District showcases homes from 1880 to 1929. The modest homes and bungalows of Five Points date from the 1920s to 1950s.



TAG ALONG WITH A LOCAL **EXPERT** to get more insight about the places you'll see when you join us for a tour. Get goose bumps on the fall Huntsville Ghost Walks or delve into the backstory of Huntsville or Madison with seasonal Guided History Tours. Stand on hallowed grounds along the Huntsville Civil Rights Landmarks Tour or get behind the wheel for the Rocket City Civil Rights Driving Tour. Set your own pace with the self-guided Digital Huntsville History Tour.



PLACES TO EXPLORE

include Alabama Constitution Hall Historic Park and Historic Huntsville Depot. Building tours are not currently offered, but the grounds are open to the public. Please check for updates. The park is where Alabama became a state in 1819. The depot, now a tribute to local transportation history, was an active passenger station until 1968. Be sure to explore the Huntsville Madison County Veterans Memorial Park. huntsville.org/things-to-do/ attractions

TAKE A HIKE

From the Spanish for "Mountain of Health," **Monte Sano State Park** is an expansive 2,140 acres of outdoor happiness. Hikers will enjoy 20 miles of trails. Those biking will have 14 miles for pedaling. In spring those trails are in full bloom with native azaleas. Daily use fees or annual park passes are available. For a place to rest your head, the park has 14 rustic cabins, 74 improved campsites, and a primitive campground.

WHERE HUNTSVILLE MEETS THE TENNESSEE RIVER

On the southern edge of the city on the banks of the Tennessee River, **Ditto Landing** is framed by mountain foothills. Fishing enthusiasts and novices alike enjoy wetting a hook to catch bass, bream, and catfish. Boaters of all types enjoy the marina. Ditto Landing is an ideal spot for water skiing and swimming, canoeing, kayaking, and stand-up paddling, as well as camping with over 70 campsites. Coming soon, kayak bass fishing.

PADDLING IN HUNTSVILLE: A NOT-SO-HIDDEN GEM

ADVENTURE ON FOOT OR BY BIKE

Transition smoothly from Monte Sano State Park to the adjacent Land Trust of North Alabama preserve with 70 more miles of trails. Blevins Gap Nature Preserve has 17.5 miles of trails of varying difficulty. In the City of Madison, Rainbow Mountain packs nearly 3.5 miles of trails into only 1.5 acres. The protected lands of Wheeler National Wildlife Refuge include the Beaverdam Creek Boardwalk for easy exploration of this unique habitat.



MEET ME AT THE PARK

A downtown gem and the waters that lured settlers over 200 years ago, **Big Spring International Park** is a popular green space with friendly ducks and geese, and the Instagram-worthy red bridge and cherry trees. **Dublin Memorial Park** in Madison keeps you active with paved walking trails, and an outdoor pool. In the Owens Cross Roads area, **Goldsmith-Schiffman Wildlife Sanctuary** is part of the North Alabama Birding Trail. Visit the CVB website for a full list of parks.

GOING PRO



Blake Art & History Center.** Established just a couple of years ago, the center has already rocketed to popularity because of the quality of its art and displays. From moving Southern scenes, to weathered faces and still life, the art is sure to move you. **Huntsville Revisited Museum**, with artifacts, photos and stories, is part of the center.





Alabama Laws

ALCOHOL

Madison County is "wet," meaning alcohol sales are allowed throughout the county seven days a week. Alabama's legal drinking age is 21. Drink responsibly and use a designated driver. Official entertainment districts allow for drinks, in designated cups, to be taken outside.

DRIVING

Alabama's distracted driving laws prohibit text messaging for all drivers. Alabama seat belt law requires all passengers to wear a seat belt. Obey posted speed limits.

MOTORCYCLES/BICYCLES

When riding a motorcycle in Alabama, either as a driver or passenger, you must wear protective headgear that is designed specifically for motorcycle riders and passengers. Be aware of posted bike lanes and cyclists on the roads.


CHILD SEATS


